OFFICIAL BOARD
HIGHWAY MISSION TABERNACLE

Meeting of the Official Board held on August 22, 1937, at the Church.

Present: Brothers Combs, McKittrick, Spain, Zell, McKinley, Bell, Hollahan, Hepworth, Carr, Krause and Green; Sisters Clark, Maud Nethery and Payne.

Brother Joseph H. Combs presided.

The meeting was opened with prayer by Brother Hollahan.

Brother Combs explained to the Board that inasmuch as there had been no decision between the two lay delegates appointed by the Church to represent Highway at the General Council meeting, as to which one would act as the official delegate, owing to the fact that the Church could only send one delegate, and in accordance with the action of the Official Board meeting held on August 19, 1937, that this meeting had been called to settle the question, and in view of the fact that it involved two of the members of the Board he requested Brothers Zell and Carr to absent themselves from the meeting, which they graciously did.

Brothers Combs requested that the Clerk read her letter to Brother McKittrick and also a letter to the Official Board received from the Pastor, which was done.

After some discussion Brother Spain moved that Brother Carr be officially appointed as a lay delegate to represent Highway at the General Council meeting, and that a letter of credentials be given to him. This motion was seconded by Brother McKittrick, and after discussion and careful consideration was unanimously carried.

Brothers Zell and Carr returned to the meeting, and Brother Combs explained to them the action of the Board, and gave to Brother Carr the letter of credentials from the Church.

Brother Spain brought up the subject of advertising the special meetings to be conducted by Brother and Sister Jones, and it was suggested that Brother McKittrick endeavor to get in touch with the Pastor, and leave the matter rest until

Tuesday evening.

Brother Krause suggested that he thought it would be nice if Sister Benkert would round up the Young People's Choir and Orchestra, and have special music, both morning and evening the Sunday the Pastor and his wife return from their vacation, September 12, which was assented to by the Board.

The Church Clerk asked the privilege of inserting a paragraph in the Bulletin of September 12 welcoming the Pastor and Family home, should Brother Steelberg issue a Bulletin on that date, which was assented to by the Board.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned with prayer by Brother Krause.
