Dear Brother Steelberg:

At the Official Board meeting held today, I was instructed to send you a telegram at Byron, Wisconsin, advising you of a Board meeting with the Shirers on Wednesday evening, August 12, 1942, and requesting your presence; to send out notices to the members of the Board; and to address a letter to you at your home requesting all correspondence that has taken place concerning the Shirers return.

If you recall, the letter addressed by the Shirers to the Official Board, which was sent air mail and received by me, was forwarded to you, and is now in your possession.

However, while I was in Board meeting this morning Sister Steelberg gave to Mrs. Brook the copy of letter dated June 7, 1942, addressed by the Board to Springfield.

It appears from the minutes that there will be a number of letters to produce,

I understand, since I sent the telegram to you, that you will be home sometime on Tuesday, and I am glad that this meeting will in no way interfere with your plans for returning to Philadelphia.
