

W. QUAY ROSSELLE, D.D., our only living ex-pastor, having served us from Sept. 13th, 1908, to March 9th, 1919, prominent in denominational affairs, a recognized scholar, successful minister, at present pastor of the First Baptist Church, Malden, Mass.

A. H. VAUTIER. Noted forum lecturer, successful business man, famed speaker.

MEME BROCKWAY. Speaker on childhood; known from coast to coast; prominent on leading programs throughout the Northern Baptist Convention; magnetic and charming in her forensic role.
