FIRST ASSEMBLY AND CALVARY ASSEMBLY OF PADUCAH MERGE

The two congregations held their first service together on November 13th. Rev. Nolan D. Sluder preached his farewell message in the morning service on the subject: "We Are Laborers Together". Following a delightful fellowship noon dinner in the basement of the Calvary Church, District Superintendent W. G. Hinecker brought a very fitting and stirring message from I Corinthians 12:31, entitled "A More Excellent Way". In the evening evangelistic service, Brother Lee. H. Porter spoke on the subject: "Calvary".

-----FIRST ASSEMBLY-----

The First Assembly of God Church launched a building program in 1944 under the direction of Bro. Leonard G. Cranor. The church grew steadily under his pastorate and the other ministers who followed him. Bro. L.H. Porter became pastor in May, 1950 and since that time, the membership has grown and the church building has been remodelled in addition to the construction of a brick residence in 1952 at 520 Clay St. which is now the parsonage.

-----CALVARY ASSEMBLY-----

The first services of Calvary Assembly of God were held on Feb. 1, 1953, in a small frame building at its present location. Rev. Nolan Sluder was founder and has served as pastor since that time. Construction of a stone edifice began in June, 1953 and the church's growing congregation began holding services in the basement of the new building in August of that year. On Easter Sunday of 1954, the first services were held in the new auditorium.

Rev. L. H. Porter is the pastor of the newly-combined congregations and they are using the building of the Calvary Assembly and in the future will use the name: "Calvary Assembly of God".
