Austin Miles was the minister of music at that time and he composed that hymn. Bonnie also told how the architect of this building died in the Civil war and it was the only building he ever built.

Betty Roberson and Walter McAnney thrilled our souls with the renditions on the beautiful Hilbourne Roosevelt pipe organ. The 11 member bell choir played in both the morning and evening services. They played Holy, Holy, Holy and Jesus Reigns. Other outstanding vocalists ministered.

In the evening service it was gratifying to see the local ministers lining the platform and their congregations filling the pews. A beautiful altar service followed. The singing and praises to the Lord reminded one of an old fashioned camp meeting in the downtown setting of Philadelphia.

An anniversary cake was served at the very end of the day with coffee and punch and more fellowship.

It will be a day long remembered. Lingering most in our minds was the fact that we were surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses of those who had gone on before and those of you who still support us in substance and prayers. May God bless each of you in His own special way for the blessing you have been to the ongoing ministry of Highway these many years.
