Gratefully, I acknowledged the willingness and sincere help from the National WMC Department. From four groups we have reached 84. With membership growth has also come financial growth. The past yearly report indicates the giving of the Potomac District WMC's exceeded \$21,100.00. To this could be added several Potomac District WMC thousand dollars more which had not been reported. ministry has reached into the farthest outposts as well as in the homeland. Significant tokens of such ministry are evident at Bethany Retirement Home where a plaque is on a door stating the furnishings of that bedroom were made possible by Potomac District WMC's. The electric organ in the beautiful lobby also bespeaks Potomac District WMC's. From our first district-wide WMC project for equipment in the Port Said, Egypt Bible School to the camp cot mattresses at camp, is a long trail of our WMC ministries.

On WMC Day, July, 1964, we received our first coin-project offering. The total of DIMES FOR HOME MISSIONS came to \$760.34. The 1965 coin project (as of this writing) amounts to \$1,254.00. This is quite an increase and will provide an impetus for Home Missions in our District.

The 1964-65 District-wide WMC project (renovating the camp cot mattresses) has reached \$1,040.66, leaving a balance of \$183.34 on the cost of the work.

THE TOUR OF YOUR LIFE, theme of Missionette Day, was truly a Tour and we are still receiving kind words regarding it. We are most grateful to each Tour Leader and to the WMC Sectional Representatives who helped make the day a success. Sisters Florence Buila (Tour of the Headwaters), Mildred Kimel (Tour of the Highlands), Marjorie Richendrfer (Tour of the Homelands), and Ann Ahlf (Tour of the Heartlands) gave fine presentations and will be long remembered for their words of counsel. The special features on WMC DAY just made it a Day of Days. We owe much to Sister Florence Bogdan and her co-workers for their untiring work in preparing the beautiful and most attractive pump-apple tree mural. This added so much to the dime offering. The message of Sister Ahlf lingers in our minds and her words and admonition will yet bring forth fruit. We say again to these ministers and to you, "thank you" for making these two days the "highlights" of the camp season.
