The Minutes of the previous meeting, Feb. 5th, 1940, Were approved as read.

Also the Treasurer's report was accepteds read,

The Flower Committee did not have anything of especial interest to report. Robt. Anderson and Walter McAnney were called upon as a committee to serve for the following six months. on this committee.

Upon motion duly made and seconded Edgar and Paul Overstreet were accepted into the membership of the Ushers' ?Assocation. Unanimously carried.

By popular acclamation Brother Allan Hummell and Oscar Schmel were relelected to serve another six months, the former as president and the latter as vice president. Wesley Steelberg presented this suggestion in the form of a motion which was duly seconded by Geo. McKinley, and carried unanimously by those present.

Befire adjournment there was a brief discussion on how the ushers could best discharge their duties in back of the church. Mention was made of several complaints of the lack of interest shown to folks who enter or leave the church, and different suggestions were offered to overcome this situation, among which were that the presiding officer in charge station an usher at each aisle, whose duty will be not only to direct the people to their seats but also extend a friendly greeting, and that during the course of the service the officer appoint two ushers to remain seated at the rear of the church, whose duty it will be to take care of the folks who arrive late or find it necessary to leave earlier.

As there was nothing further to discuss the meeting adjourned with a closing word of prayer. Signed.
