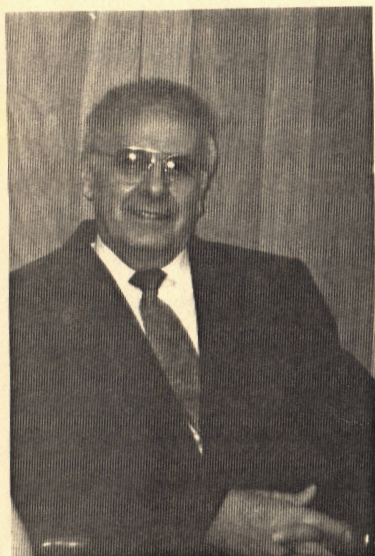


It is a distinct pleasure to have Reverend Philip Bongiorno, Superintendent of the Pennsylvania-Delaware District Council, as our guest speaker today.
