

Sunday November 1 & 1953

On Sunday November 1, the Board of Trustees met and interviewed a Mr. & Mrs. Vanderick for the job of Sexton and his wife. The Board was impressed by them although they were catholic ✓ and he said that he smoked, but would not smoke on the premises, after much discussion the Board decided against them. The *Trustees* also ran two ads in the Philadelphia Inquirer. The first week nine ads were received in answer to the job, the second week only three ads were received.

On Tuesday night November 3, three members of the Board of Trustees met at the Metropolitan Opera House at Broad and Poplar Streets to interview a man named Leon Grzybowski of 624 N. 5th Street Philadelphia, who was recommended to us by Pastor Demetreus in answer to our appeal for a sexton to fill Ernie Harris job. Bro. Oscar Schmeal was to take the Bro. and his wife through the church on Wednesday November 4, to show them just what has to be done.

November 15, 1953

A motion was made by Bro. Oscar Schmeal and second by Bro. MacPherson to have six keys made for the organ and to have them stamped from 1 to 6. To be given to those who are prospects to play the organ in the future each one to sign for his or her key with a promise not to lend or have a duplicate key made at any time.

The Board of Trustees also decided to have the locks on the front door changed, as there are too many keys in circulation. Also to have them stamped from 1 to 14, and for each one to sign for his or her key with the promise not to have a duplicate key made at any time without the consent of the Board.
