I was taught that John was the "Love" apostle; so aware of the love of God that the theme of love permeated his Gospel and letters. Indeed, he's the author of one of the most famous verses in the world, John 3:16, which is a powerful assertion of God's love.

John's emphasis on love is unquestionable, but, as I read through John this past week, it was another word stood out to me: truth.

What a powerful testimony of the nature of God! John's Gospel famously begins by establishing that Jesus is the Word of God – the eternal, infallible, immutable Word of God – in bodily form. Jesus, then is not just truthful and not just the author of the truth; he *is* the truth.

John said that his purpose in writing the Gospel was that people would believe and, as a result, have life in



Jesus' name. It makes sense, then, that he reinforces truth so often in making his case. John's argument, to paraphrase Peter, is not hinged on cleverly made up stories but on eyewitness accounts. (Please reference II Peter I:16)

Certainly, God's love is a central aspect of the truth of the Gospel, but it is not the whole truth. As Christ's ambassadors, we have the obligation to go beyond the truth of God's love and tell the world of his holiness and power and of the sacrifice that he demands from those who would follow him.

Let us be people of the truth! In particular, when we share the Gospel, let us not sugarcoat or shy away from any aspect of it. John shows us that Gospel of love is not at odds with the truth of the Gospel, but that, in fact, the two go hand in hand.

Speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ. (Ephesians 4:15)
