My dog and I, you won't be surprised to learn, perceive the world differently. She experiences it mostly through her sense of smell, and I, primarily, by sight. I notice this when we we're out on walks. She loves to linger, motionless, at our corner for minutes at a time. She's not exactly motionless, actually; her nose twitches from time to time, as she tries to zero in on a particular scent. I get as impatient with her as she does with me when I pause to read a poster in a shop window or on a telephone pole. She has no idea why I'm stopping there, where there are no interesting scents.



I think that we humans often fail to understand why God moves — or pauses — because we don't perceive the world as he does. When we walk through life relying on our five senses to tell us what's going on around us, we end up either lingering over something that strikes us as interesting when God is ready to move on, or tugging at the leash, as it were, because we're ready to move on and can't conceive why he's holding us back.

We can find several instances of God opening people's eyes in the Bible. He opened Hagar's eyes to a brook, when she had run out of water for her son, Ishmael, Balaam's eyes to the angel with a drawn sword who was standing in front of his donkey, and Elisha's servant's eyes so that he could God's chariots, which outnumbered those of their enemies. In Jesus' time on Earth, he opened the eyes of his disciples so that they could recognize his resurrected body, and he opened the eyes of the men on the road to Emmaus to the prophecies written about him in the Old Testament.

When we find ourselves unsure where God is leading or why he has us stalled in one place, it's appropriate for us to ask him to open our eyes. There will be times when he keeps us in the dark for a season, and that's when faith takes over. Wherever we find ourselves, we simply need to be still and allow him to speak to us — through Scripture, through a song, or through our brothers and sisters in Christ — until we see what he sees.

Be strong, do not fear; your God will come (...) Then will the eyes of the blind be opened and the ears of the deaf unstopped. (Isaiah 35:4,5)
